<p>ROSE POLICARPIO DACANAY</p> <p>Deployed by Saranay Philippines Inc in May 2013 to work as a domestic helper for Ms. Noha Almukiri and Mr. Musko Almutaise Laxara.</p> <p>Transferred to a new employer without a new contract.</p>	<p>Jailed June 2013, implicated in the murder of her employer. Perpetrators attempted to rape her. (21 months – Malaz Jail)</p> <p>June 2013 – Immediately filed for assistance at the DFA, POEA and OVP.</p> <p>February 1, 2014 – Met Amb. Ezzedin Tago at the Makati Traders Hotel through Mr. Rashid Fabricante.</p> <p>February 3, 2015 – Endorsed by Migrante.</p> <p>February 2015 – Rose disclosed that during the time of investigation, Jerome Frias of PE forced her to admit the accusations in front of the Saudi police.</p> <p>March 17, 2015 – Rose called and reported that the relatives of the employer are not attending the hearings.</p> <p>March 24, 2015 – DFA stated that she is a candidate for deathrow</p> <p>According to DFA, charges were already dropped. The original employer is not cooperating for her release.</p>	<p>Written report from the DFA on the current status of case.</p> <p>Provide legal defense for appeal.</p> <p>Mandatory insurance claim.</p>
<p>MANOLITO MIRA CARBONELL</p> <p>Deployed by GBMLT Manpower Services in January 2013 to work as trailer driver for Almarai Company.</p>	<p>Detained June 8, 2014, accused of illegally picking up passengers when 2 Ethiopian women went into his truck when he parked it during truck ban. (9 months – Malaz Jail)</p> <p>June 2014 - Immediately went to POEA and DFA to report the incident and filed for assistance.</p> <p>November 26, 2014 – Endorsed by Migrante.</p> <p>February 2015 – Manolito through a phone call shared to Anita that according to Omar of PE he was sentenced to 1 year imprisonment for “transporter human trafficking.” Gelo of the DFA confirmed this report.</p>	<p>Written report from the DFA on the current status of case.</p> <p>Provide legal defense for appeal.</p> <p>Mandatory insurance claim.</p>

	<p>March 23, 2015 – The DFA reported that hearings on his case were ongoing. But according to Manolito, he was not able to attend any hearing.</p>	
<p>ELLA MAE TAMPUS ONGRIA</p> <p>Deployed by Golden Future International Manpower Agency and worked as a domestic helper for Ali Sayed Shrf Alghamdey in Riyadh, KSA.</p>	<p>Detained in August 28, 2014, Saudi police took her because her employer accused her of theft. She ran away from her employer due to maltreatment. (7 months – Malaz Jail)</p> <p>Family has no contact since then.</p> <p>September 2014 – Relatives filed for assistance in Davao and Manila.</p> <p>They only received news from repatriated OFWs who met her in jail.</p> <p>March 13, 2015 – Endorsed by Migrante</p>	<p>Written report from the DFA on the current status of case.</p> <p>Provide legal defense for appeal on grounds of the mental state of the OFW.</p> <p>Mandatory insurance claim.</p>
<p>MARILYN PORRAS RESTOR</p> <p>Working for Princess Hayfa Bander Moh'd Abdulrahman Al Saud for more than 10 years as Domestic Helper</p>	<p>June 13, she was forcefully abducted by Princess Maha bint Bander bin Abdullah bin Abdulrahman Al Saud. Until now, Mrs. Restor, and two more OFWs, are still in the hands of Princess Maha and her husband Prince Saud Sami Mohammad Al Sudairi.</p> <p>Philippine Embassy is well aware of her case and of 9 other OFWs who have experienced grave abuse from the royal couple.</p> <p>September 16, 2014, PE requested the MOFA to create a committee that will conduct an investigation on the cases of abuse and direct the Saudi police to immediately secure custody of 3 OFWs and present them to PE.</p> <p>March 16, 2015 – Endorsed by Migrante</p>	<p>Since there is no action from Saudi government since September...</p> <p>Conduct an independent mission to extract the 3 OFWs from the royal couple.</p>
<p>ROCHELLE LECHIDO MASUBAY</p> <p>Deployed by Fors Recruitment Agency in May 25, 2014 to work as a DH for Mohammed Abdalh Mohammed Al-Zahrany</p>	<p>June 26, 2014 – Last contact with Rochelle. Family tried to contact her several times.</p> <p>January 2015 – OFW's common law husband went to the agency. They informed that Rochelle died in October 16, 2014 based on a letter from the PCG. According to a staff, the OFW locked herself in her room for two days and when they opened the room they saw her dead and with a stab wound on the chest.</p> <p>February 2015 – The husband received the death certificate at the POEA which stated that she committed suicide.</p>	<p>Conduct an independent investigation and pursue a case against her employers.</p> <p>Hold the PCG accountable for not reaching her family to inform them of her death.</p>
